The 83 members of the Progressive Caucus also belong to the Democratic Socialists of America (DSA), a confederation of socialists formed in 1983 when a splinter group of the Socialist Party (Michael Harrington’s Democratic Socialist Organizing Committee, DSOC) merged with the Students for a Democratic

Society's (SDS) splinter group, the New American Movement (NAM). The main aim of DSA was to convert the Democratic Party into a social democratic organization. To that end, during the early 1990's, the DSA hosted the Progressive Caucus' website, which contained the names of its members.
